India and Malaysia have strong cultural, historical as well as trade ties since ancient times. Both countries are full members of the Commonwealth of Nations, Asian Union, and G15. The two countries are on excellent friendly terms and Malaysia is home to a strong concentration of Indian immigrants. The two have also signed a Comprehensive Economic Cooperation Agreement (CECA) in 2011 alongside cooperation in sectors of IT, Services, Tourism, Indian medicine, and numerous cultural exchange programs. India is a prime destination for Malaysian students, particularly in the medical field. To an estimate, more than 30% of the doctors in Malaysia have been educated in India. The Indian government provides scholarships to Malaysian students. India-Malaysia defense relations have progressively grown over the years with Defense Cooperation meetings at the level of Defense Secretary being held regularly. Malaysia is the third-largest trading partner for India within ASEAN, and India is the largest trading partner for Malaysia from among the countries of the South, excluding China. Malaysia is currently one of the largest investors in India with increasing foreign direct investment inflows year after year. There are over 100 Indian companies including 60 Indian joint ventures operating in Malaysia. On the trade front, their bilateral trade volume is poised to reach \$25 billion by 2020. The Symposium aims at understanding the areas of economic cooperation between both the nations and the means with which the economic cooperation between the two could be further enhanced.
